July 18, 2017

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT LOIS GOULD.

Highlights were the Corning Museum of Glass, with exhibits featuring 5,000 years of glass wares from 3,500 BC to the present; the Dorflinger Glass Museum in White Mills, Pennsylvania; and presentations by knowledgeable glass experts, especially Master Engraver Max Erlacher. The Dorflinger Glass Works created exquisite cut glass, including stemware for the White House from Lincoln's administration to Wilson's.
